

Docks in Day at CYC - Saturday May 10, 2025 Rowing boats and equipment to CYC - weekend of May 31 and June 1, 2025









Rowing PEI Safety Rules - Charlottetown

- The name of each rower will be recorded in a daily log book. The log will include the time of departure and return, which boat the rower occupied, and a cell phone number for at least one person in each boat.
- Rowers must stay in sight of the safety boat operator at all times and follow directions from the safety.
- Shells must stay close to shore, not in the channel.
- Rower must be accompanied by a safety boat if using any flat water shell.

Rowing PEI Safety Rules - Rules of the water

- All rowers should be aware of the other traffic on the harbour. Large power boats, cruise ships and commercial vessels may NOT be looking for rowing shells. It's important to stay out of their way. Don't underestimate their speed. They can travel quickly.
- Cruise ships are already back for the season. Some days will have multiple ships
- If you should swamp or fall out of the boat, stay with the boat it floats. Do not swim for shore. Blow your whistle in 3 short bursts at regular intervals. Wave your safety flag. Always stay with your boat.
- Be considerate, polite and cordial. Voices travel long distances over calm water. *this also applies at Brackley. It's a hotel.

Rowing PEI Safety Rules - Rules of the water

- Be aware of wind conditions: 15 km/h max for flat shells, 25 km/h max for coastal shells. These are rule-of-thumb limits only. The safety person makes the final decision.
- Shells and safety boats are to be used only during daylight,
 30 minutes before sunrise until sunset.
- Rowing is forbidden within 30 minutes of thunder and lightning or when fog is present.
- All rowers must wear a Personal Flotation Device (PFD).
 Rowers under the age of 16 must wear a non-inflatable PFD.

Rowing PEI Safety Rules - Rules of the water

- It's important to be as visible as possible. We encourage bright clothing and hats, especially at dawn and dusk.
- Be cautious exiting the yacht club docking area. Watch for other boats. Large sailboats and pontoon boats come around the corner into the marina and may not see you coming out.
- Generally, rowing in Charlottetown harbour is conducted downstream and to the west of Charlottetown Yacht Club, along the shore.
- NEVER go in the channel. NEVER go under the Hillsborough Bridge.


Safe Havens in Charlottetown



How to sign up for rows! Sign Up Genius!!





Grade 1 (Too cold) Conditions

- No rowing if air temperature is below 0°C or water temperature is below 5°C.
- Water Temp in Degrees C Loss of Dexterity Exhaustion or Unconsciousness
- 4.5 to 10°C Under 5 min. 30 to 60 min.
- 10 to 15.5°C
 10 to 15 min.
 1 to 2 hrs.
- 15.5 to 21°C 30 to 40 min. 2 to 7 hrs.



Grade 2 (Very cold) Conditions:

- If air temperature is above 0°C and the water temperature is between 8° and 10°C:
- A safety boat must be used. The number of rowers must not exceed the seating capacity of the safety boat.
- All crews are required to stay within 250m of each other and the safety boat, and close to shore.
- Experienced rowers only.
- Only coastal doubles and coastal quad
- Winds should be 15 km/h or less.

Grade 3 (Cold) Conditions:

- If air temperature is above 0°C and the water temperature is between 10° and 15°C:
- A safety boat must be used.
- All crews are required to stay within sight of each other and the safety boat, and close to shore.



Grade 4 (Warm) Conditions:

- When the air temperature is above 5°C and the water temperature is above 15°C:
- Rows with coastal shells can be scheduled without an accompanying safety boat.
- Flat water boats must still always have an accompanying safety boat.




Charlottetown Water Temperature

(Today) 3rd May 2024


3.4°C / 38.1°F

Rowing PEI Safety Rules -Double on the Dock

- When only one coastal shell is going out, rowers will inform the Responsible Person on Shore of their departure, destination or direction of travel, and intended time of return.
- The rowers will notify the Responsible Person on Shore upon their return.
- We call this "Double on the Dock".





Safety rules - Brackley

- Take special care when carrying boats to and from the water. The ground is uneven.
- Listen carefully to instructions from the coaches.
- Always wear a PFD and wear shoes that are easily removed at the dock.
- Bring a change of clothing and towel to every practice.
- Stay within sight of the coach boat at all times.

BOAT CARE AT BRACKLEY - it is crucial that the boats and all parts are washed after every row. We have some very lovely new equipment and we need to care for it.

Every boat to be thoroughly washed every single row. Includes all hardware; riggers, oarlocks, seat wheels, rails EVERYTHING. Also the hull but don't skimp on the hardware. Seats to be taken off and wheels individually cleaned with fresh water.

Safe Sport Manuals

Rowing Prince Edward Island Safe Sport Policy Manual **Effective August 1, 2021**Rowing PEI Safe Sport Manual **- Effective January 20, 2022**

Rowing PEI (the club) has adopted the Safe Sport Manual in line with requirements set by Rowing Canada Aviron (RCA) and Rowing Prince Edward Island, our governing rowing bodies.

.There are five policies as part of this manual:

- 1. Code of Conduct and Ethics
- 2. Harassment, Discipline and Complaints Policy
- 3. Appeal Policy
- 4. Social Media Policy
- 5. Screening Policy

All members will need to acknowledge annually that they have read and agree to abide by these safe sport policies as a member of Rowing PEI and Rowing Prince Edward Island.

Safe Sport - Rule of Two

Rowing Prince Edward Island and Rowing PEI have adopted Rowing Canada's Safe Sport Manual.

Rowing Prince Edward Island has a fundamental obligation and responsibility to protect the health, safety and physical and mental well-being of every individual that is involved in the Province of Prince Edward Island rowing community.



Safe Sport - Rule of Two





Purpose of Rule of Two

To protect minor athletes in potentially vulnerable situations by ensuring more than one adult is present

2 Certified Coaches





Rule of Two - Open and Observable Environment

The name refers to the fact that interactions between an individual and an individual who is in a position of trust/authority should be in an environment or space that is both "open" and "observable" to others.

What is an 'open' environment? • An open environment is an environment that is not closed or concealed from others. • Interactions should not take place behind closed doors or in secluded locations. • Others should be aware the interaction is taking place. What is an 'observable' environment? • An observable environment is a space where others can see or take note of the interaction. Before interacting with someone ask yourself: • Is this an open interaction? • Are we in a closed or secluded place? • Who knows this meeting/interaction is taking place? • Does the athlete (or individual in a position of lesser power) have an easy and accessible exit path? • Is this interaction observable? • Is anyone else with us? • Can anyone see us? • What about hear us?

Concussion Awareness

RCA believes that the welfare of everyone involved in our sport is a foremost consideration and has created a Concussion Management Policy to ensure the focus of each individual and member in the rowing community is always on long term health.

RCA's Concussion Management Policy and associated procedures provide guidelines on how concussion education and management should be addressed at all levels of rowing throughout Canada. The policy addresses four key areas including Prevention and Awareness, Recognition and Removal, Assessment, and Return to Rowing. It aims to ensure that anyone in rowing with a suspected concussion receives timely and appropriate care with proper management to allow them to return to rowing safely.


